Call for applications for Admission into New Undergraduate Programmes Offered by the Department of Procurement, Logistics and Transport in the College of Business and Economics

The Management of the University of Rwanda is delighted to inform the public that under the Priority Skills for Growth (PSG) program implemented by the Government of Rwanda, in partnership with the World Bank, it has obtained Higher Education Council approval to offer the following two new undergraduate programs:

1. Bachelor of Science with Honours in Procurement, Logistics and Supply Chain Management
2. Bachelor of Science with Honours in Transport Management.

The University of Rwanda is, therefore, inviting applications from both privately and government sponsored candidates who wish to study either during the **day** and/or **evening** in the above programs offered by the School of Business, Department of Procurement, Logistics and Transport of the College of Business and Economics at Gikondo Campus.

All candidates are advised to apply online as described on the UR website (www.admissions.ur.ac.rw). The Online application system is open and will be closed on Friday 31st January 2020 at Midnight. All candidates are advised to pay the required application fees and submit their applications before that deadline. Since the registration will also follow thereafter candidates who will get admitted will be required to register and should be ready start classes early in February 2020.

Note: While privately sponsored candidates are encouraged to apply, we also encourage eligible candidates who wish to get government sponsorship to apply.
